The Call To Action

- I/I - Inefficient system (estimating 1 mgd out, 3 mgd in)
- History of violations
 - Overflows (EPA) - 16 in last three years (documented to OHM)
 - Pressurization (EPA) – 4 violations since 2015 (documented)
- Disruption of service / break history
- Unpredictable/reliable perspectives from private sector
- Not cost effective – Unnecessarily treating large volumes of inflow
- Fix it now...or fix it later...

Project Cost

- Total opinion of probable cost 20 million dollars
 - Sewer and Water
 - Phase I – 2.5 million
 - Phase II – 14 million
 - Roadway repair, reconstruction, traffic management
 - 3-5 million

Phase I Cost/Funding Summary

EPA \$1,452,000 million (principal forgiveness)

OPWC \$500,00 (grant)

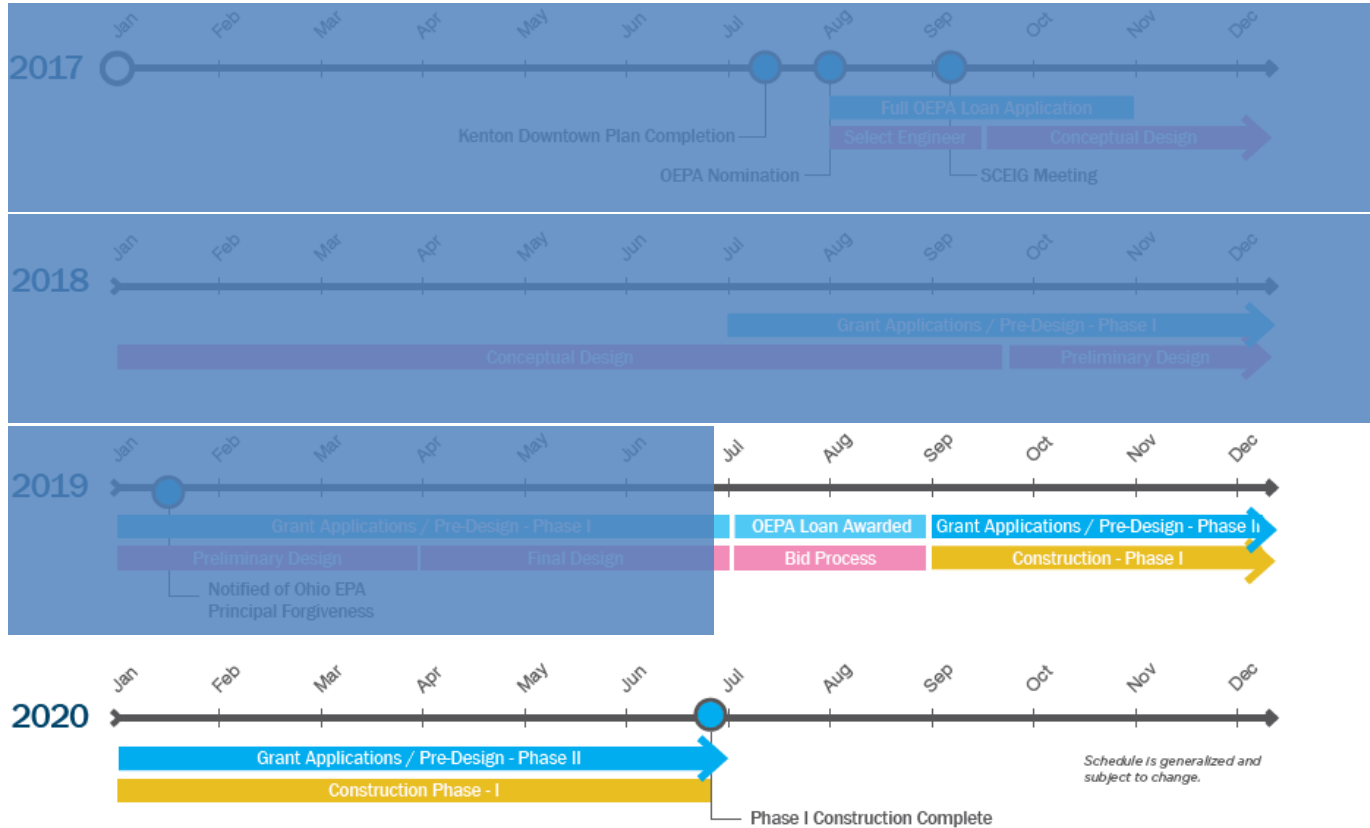
Total - \$1,952,000

Total Cost Phase I - \$2,250,000*

**note includes adding Walnut and Ohio Street beyond original scope, and is current opinion of probable cost*

Project 87% funded through grants and principal forgiveness!
